### ? The Purpose Formula

When we want to answer the question “Why?”, we use the **to-infinitive** (the word “**to**” followed by the **base form of the verb**).

Here is how we build these sentences:

### Real-World Examples:

- “He went to the shops **to buy** some shoes.”
- “I’m writing this email **to ask** for your help.”
- “My father runs every day **to keep** healthy.”
